On June 12, The Foundation gathered with board members of past and present to recognize the invaluable contributions those individuals have given The Foundation over the years and to announce and celebrate two significant gifts.

The evening began with Board Chair Steve Schultz acknowledging the more than 60 individuals in attendance for their time and dedication to The Foundation. "Each of you has played a pivotal role in advancing our mission, guiding us with wisdom, and ensuring our initiatives make a meaningful impact," Schultz said.

As we previously reported in the 2023 Annual Report, The Foundation was the recipient of two extraordinary gifts from Jim and Mary Jo Risk and Betty and Dick Nelson in the last year which inspired the naming of two staff positions in their honor – the James Kirby Risk President and CEO and the Betty M. Nelson Director of Philanthropy. The June 12th event allowed the opportunity to publicly announce those gifts and to celebrate the donors who made them possible. David Lasater was introduced with his new title for the first time and noted the pivotal impact Jim Risk has had on The Foundation since its inception. "Over the years, the Risk family name has become synonymous with community, collaboration, leadership, and success in the business and nonprofit community. I am deeply humbled and honored to serve as the inaugural 'James Kirby Risk President and CEO," said Lasater.

Jim Risk addressed the group, "The reality is, the gratitude goes to The Community Foundation Board for providing the Risk family the opportunity to establish the President & CEO Endowment. The Risk family has had a love affair with this community for more than 100 years. We all feel that life's happiest moments emerge from helping those in need. There is nothing more gratifying than enriching the lives of others." He also thanked those in the room for leaving their collective fingerprints on our community through their work with The Foundation.

Candy Silver introduced Betty M. Nelson, noting the influence Betty has had on Candy's perspective of philanthropy and working with donors. "Sitting across the table from her, hearing those two simple words, 'everything matters,' had a great impact on me personally and my work at The Foundation. From the paper we use for acknowledgement letters to our meaningful relationships with others. Every detail, every person - is important," said Silver.

Thanks to these momentous gifts, The Foundation's administrative fee has been reduced from 1.5% to 1.25% in 2024, which generates even more funding to support our community.
